Have any of these equipment measures been screened / considered for early replacement or retrofit programs? If so, what were the criteria for not including these measures in the residential rebate program?

**Response**

Residential customers interested in replacing equipment can do so at any time through the residential rebate program, regardless of the age of the equipment. No measures were excluded from the program based on assumptions regarding equipment age. Because IPL does not know the state of equipment being replaced, an assumption of replacement-on-burnout provides a conservative estimate of savings.
